- to combat child labour through education

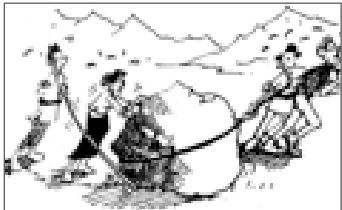
Education for children is not a privilege but a right.
